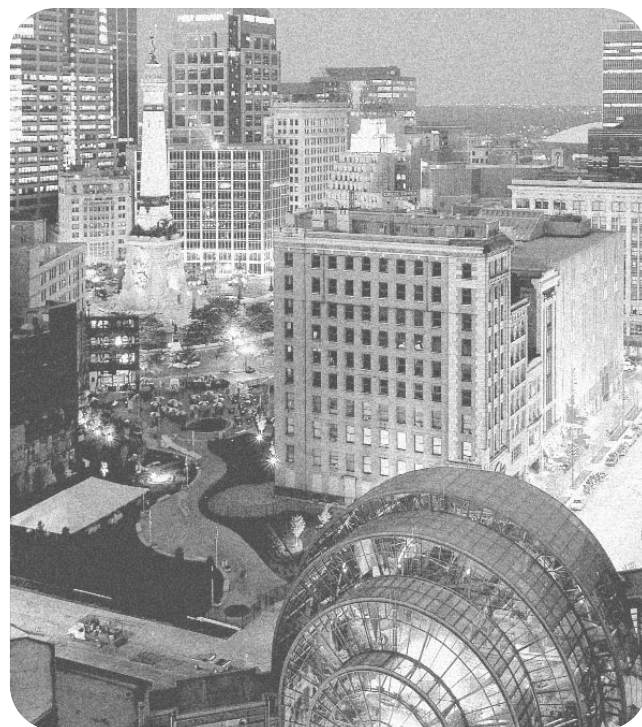
Celebrate the past in an 1836 living village and get a taste of 19th century living! This authentic settlement is one of America's finest and most unusual living history museums. As the village residents go about their daily chores, you will meet the townspeople, chat about current politics (of the 1830's) and hear the ring of the blacksmith's hammer. Some hands-on displays allow you to participate. Price includes bus transportation and admission. You will have time in Conner Prairie for lunch on your own.

Lace up your walking shoes and take a guided tour that will provide a close-up look at "Circle City" with facts and legends of the history and architecture of the city. As you explore downtown Indy you will get a closer look at City Center, State Capitol building, RCA Dome, Eiteljorg Museum, USS Indianapolis Monument, Medal of Honor Museum, the new NCAA Headquarters and the extensive canal system.

Indianapolis' proud heritage will soon be evident as you become familiar with some of the best known landmarks—Monument Circle, the State Capitol, the Scottish Rite Cathedral, City Market, Children's Museum, Circle Centre Mall, and Lockerbie Square (home of Raggedy Ann and Andy and Little Orphan Annie). The recent downtown renovation has restored such landmarks as the country's first Union Station, and the Soldiers' and Sailor's Monument. No trip to Indy would be complete without a stop at the home of the Indianapolis 500. At the Speedway we will visit Gasoline Alley, the Yard of Brick start/finish line, and the Hall of Fame Museum. If the track is not in use, you can experience the thrill of a lap around the track (at a slower pace!). Price includes bus transportation and admission to Speedway activities.
