
This project was funded by UW-Madison's Provost's Office through a 3-year Baldwin Wisconsin Idea grant.


METHODS

- ☐ WisContext takes the "long view" on topics so there is time to develop the topic.
- □ One challenge is writing about complicated subjects in a non-academic style.

Comparing District Revenue to Costs




CONSIDERATIONS

- WisContext uses a content management system (CMS).
- ☐ APL's interactive graphics require adding JavaScript code.
- ☐ Two methods for integrating graphics
 - Directly passing relevant code into CMS text editor.
 - Using an iframe to "open a window" onto the interactive graphic.
